



Belle Island Park - Belle Isle Park is a 2.5-mile-long, 982-acre island park, located in the international waters of the Detroit River. The park was created to provide an urban oasis in Detroit. And is affectionately named the "Jewel of Detroit", Almost one third of the island is a natural wooded area that is home to a wide variety of small animals and birds. The park features a number of historic public landmarks including an aquarium, a conservatory, Dossin Great Lakes Museum, a fountain, and more. The bridge to enter Belle Isle Park is located at the intersection of Jefferson Ave and East Grand Blvd.

Campus Martius Park - 800 Woodward Ave, Detroit, MI 48226

Campus Martius Park is in the immediate downtown community and surrounded by wonderful restaurants. It is a place to sit and enjoy the beauty of Downtown Detroit, the fountain, landscaping, and gardens. The park also has some historical points of interest. Detroit Riverfront - From Campus Martius Park you can walk southeast on Woodward for about three blocks to Hart Plaza. Along the way, you may will see the Spirit of Detroit, a large chess set, seasonal activities on Woodward Ave., the "fist" (a tribute to Joe Lewis), artwork, other monuments, historical markers, the waterfront, and just a beautiful view of Detroit. Campers have enjoyed these downtime activities.

Theater District - It's pretty amazing can now Detroit can boast that it is the second largest theater district only behind New York City! It is always worth checking to see what events are happening while you are in Detroit. Many of the theaters are historic. They have been restored and are absolutely beautiful. The Fox Theater is beyond description. There are 5000 seats, some of which are waiting for your team. The Detroit Opera House and the Fisher Theater are also amazing. These are only three out of the many venues. Your team will have an evening to remember visiting the theater district.

People Mover and the QLine - While the QLine is new, the People Mover has been around since 1987. Go online to discover what is at every stop on both of these methods of transportation. The People Mover travels on a raised single track, is driverless, and simply loops the central business district. It has 13 stations and only cost \$.75 to ride. The QLine is a 6.6 mile streetcar that loops Woodward Ave. (It goes back and forth 3.3 miles!) It costs \$1.50 to ride within a 3 hour period.
