The Dominican Republic was blessed to hold our Forum in September. It was a joy to have our partners here with us to experience daily life and see the work. We also held a country wide worship service to celebrate the start of the new academic year at the Seminary. In the last month a new missionary Deaconess was commissioned and installed and a new missionary pastor was ordained and installed. We had much to celebrate together. This summer we had some awesome Vacation Bible Schools on the field. Deaconess Caitlin helped write a program which was used at four different churches for their VBS activities. Deaconess Caitlin helped lead two week long events in Santiago, Dominican Republic. At the

first church, Pueblo Nuevo we had 30 children for our first real in person children's ministries since the pandemic began. The congregation is now having in person Sunday

school again along side of worship. At the second congregation, Palmar Arriba we had almost 200 children participate. It was a crazy week, we prepared for 50 kids and had four times that amount there to hear the

Gospel. Our Good Shepard provides, we were



able to make the craft supplies stretch for all the kids and everyone had a wonderful time learning about our Shepard and listening to His voice!
