The Specific Ministry Pastor (SMP)

program is a distance education program that prepares men for pastoral ministry. The SMP program is designed to meet the needs of the church for pastors in mission and ministry opportunities where a pastor with a seminary degree may not be available. It is contextual in that the men receive their academic training in the setting where they will continue to serve following ordination. The Michigan District offers Pre-SMP training through its Deacon Training Program seminars to prepare you to take the entrance exams and create portfolios required by the seminary.

Are You Interested in becoming an SMP Pastor?

District Screening Qualifications Include:

- at least two years of membership in the congregation;
- at least some post-secondary education;
- family support;
- a commitment to the Lutheran Confessions and a strong faith;
- personal qualifications according to 1 Timothy 3:1-7;
- leadership ability; and
- a place to serve.

Pre-SMP Training Seminars:

- Old Testament
- New Testament
- Christian Doctrine: Doctrine 1
- Worship
- Preaching (Homiletics)
- Spiritual life: Doctrine 2; and Witnessing: Outreach
- Teaching the Faith
- Church History

The Commission on Deacon Qualifications (CDQ) encourages you to take the other seminars of the Deacon and Pre-SMP Training Program. Serving in the field under a Supervising Pastor for some time allows you to gain ministry skills and helps confirm God's call to you to become an SMP Pastor.

Instructors

The instructors are pastors, commissioned ministers, and LCMS trained deaconesses. Some already serve as instructors in the Deacon and Pre-SMP training program.

Other Information

- \$350 per class
- Students in the Classic Plus Program will receive a hybrid of both in-person and online training.
- It is estimated that an intentional student could complete the Classic Plus Program in 18 months.

SMP Program

The SMP program is offered at both Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Mo. and Concordia Theological Seminary in Ft. Wayne, Ind. Their programs of education, however, are different.

The SMP Program involves:

- serving in your congregation as a Vicar;
- serving under your supervising pastor;
- taking intensive courses several times a year, and participating in discussions via Internet on a regular basis;
- ordination as an SMP Pastor after two years and successful completion of the program; and
- continuing education, perhaps moving toward becoming a “general” pastor.

Prior to acceptance, the seminaries will

- test you on: Old Testament, New Testament, and Doctrine. The classes will prepare you for these.
- require portfolios on: worship, preaching, spiritual life and witnessing, and teaching the faith. Your materials from classes will help you create your portfolios.
