## **About this service**

*Brothers and sisters in Christ,*

*"Jesus wept." (John 11:35)*

*Sometimes there are no words, only tears. This is a moment where there are no words, but only tears. We weep for those who have died in the events at Michigan State University. We weep for those who were injured. We weep for those who are traumatized, distressed, and were in harm's way. We weep for the entire MSU community, their families, and all who are hurting from this.*

*Jesus wept. However, Jesus did not only weep. In the midst of death and hurt and pain, Jesus brought life and peace, calm and healing.*

*Even as we mourn – even as we try to understand things beyond our comprehension – God invites us to come before Him in prayer, that we would find peace and power in the cross of Jesus Christ.*

*This service is designed for devotional use by individuals, families, and congregations. May it help you keep your eyes on Jesus in the midst of pain and loss.*

**+ The service may begin with a time of silent prayer and contemplation +**

*Opening hymn: "O Lord, Hear My Prayer" (LSB 780)*

O Lord, hear my prayer; O Lord, hear my prayer; When I call answer me.

L: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

**C: Amen.**

L: In the morning, O Lord, You hear my voice;

**C: In the morning I prepare a sacrifice for You and watch.**

L: My mouth is filled with Your praise,

**C: And with Your glory all the day.**

L: O Lord, open my lips,

**C: And my mouth will declare Your praise.**

L: Glory be to the Father and to the Son

**C: And to the Holy Spirit;**

L: As it was in the beginning,

**C: Is now, and will be forever. Amen.**

## First reading: Psalm 42

As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and appear before God? My tears have been my food day and night, while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?" These things I remember, as I pour out my soul: how I would go with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God with glad shouts and songs of praise, a multitude keeping festival. Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God. My soul is cast down within me; therefore I remember you from the land of Jordan and of Hermon, from Mount Mizar. Deep calls to deep at the roar of your waterfalls; all your breakers and your waves have gone over me. By day the Lord commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life. I say to God, my rock: "Why have you forgotten me? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?" As with a deadly wound in my bones, my adversaries taunt me, while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?" Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

*[Time of silent prayer]*

L: Let us pray. Almighty God, indeed our souls are cast down this day. We are cast down by our own sin, and the sin of others that has led to the tragic loss of life at Michigan State University. And yet, O Lord, we place our hope in You. As a deer pants for flowing streams, so our souls thirst for You, the living God. Be near us this day in the midst of things we cannot understand. Be near us this day, as we grieve. Be near us this day, as we begin to heal, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

**C: Amen.**

*Hymn: "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" (LSB 770)*

1. What a friend we have in Jesus, All our sins and griefs to bear!  
What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer!  
Oh, what peace we often forfeit; Oh, what needless pain we bear –  
All because we do not carry everything to God in prayer!
2. Have we trials and temptations? Is there trouble anywhere?  
We should never be discouraged – take it to the Lord in prayer.  
Can we find a friend so faithful who will all our sorrows share?  
Jesus knows our ev'ry weakness – take it to the Lord in prayer.

Precious Savior, still our refuge – Take it to the Lord in prayer.  
Do thy friends despise, forsake thee? Take it to the Lord in prayer.  
In His arms He'll take and shield thee; Thou wilt find a solace there.

## Second reading: Psalm 43

Vindicate me, O God, and defend my cause against an ungodly people, from the deceitful and unjust man deliver me! For you are the God in whom I take refuge; why have you rejected me? Why do I go about mourning because of the oppression of the enemy? Send out your light and your truth; let them lead me; let them bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling! Then I will go to the altar of God, to God my exceeding joy, and I will praise you with the lyre, O God, my God. Why are you cast down, O

my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

*[Time of silent prayer]*

L: Let us pray. O Lord, in You alone do we find refuge. In You alone do we find peace and protection. Comfort those who mourn. Heal those who are injured. Send out your light and your truth; let them lead us through this dark hour into the eternal light of Your Son, Jesus Christ, Our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

**C: Amen.**

*Hymn: "Jesus, Grant That Balm and Healing" (LSB 421, v. 1, 4, 5)*

1. Jesus, grant that balm and healing in Your holy wounds I find,  
Ev'ry hour that I am feeling pains of body and of mind.  
Should some evil thought within tempt my treach'rous heart to sin,  
Show the peril, and from sinning keep me from its first beginning.
  
4. Ev'ry wound that pains or grieves me by Your wounds, Lord, is made whole;  
When I'm faint, Your cross revives me, Granting new life to my soul.  
Yes, Your comfort renders sweet ev'ry bitter cup I meet;  
For Your all-atoning passion has procured my soul's salvation.
  
5. O my God, my rock and tower, Grant that in Your death I trust,  
Knowing death has lost its power since You crushed it in the dust.  
Savior, let Your agony ever help and comfort me;  
When I die be my protection, Light and life and resurrection.

**Third reading: John 1:1-14**

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light. The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

*[Time of silent prayer]*

L: Let us pray. Blessed Jesus, the Light of the World, You came to earth to dwell in the midst of human brokenness. You know our faults. You know our frailty. You know our suffering, our pain, and even death itself. And yet, O Lord, You bring light. You are the true light that conquers darkness, that all who believe in Your name are rightly called children of God. Dwell in our midst this day and always. Point us always to the peace and power of Your cross. **C: Amen.**

*Hymn: "The Lamb" (LSB 547)*
