Convocation Grants Terms & Conditions

- Synodical bylaws state that in years that do not have a District or Synod convention, the circuits
 of the Districts are tasked with holding a Circuit Convocation. These convocations should
 "demonstrate that we are people of hope, vigorously sharing the love of Christ."
- 2. Convocation events should accent the ministry of reconciliation, which is the Michigan District's "theme" for 2024. They can take the shape of i) a conference that focuses on congregations coming together for mission ii) a community event that brings people from the congregation and community together or iii) a project that serves the needs of people in their community.
- 3. Special attention must be given to involving laypeople from the circuit.
- Grants will be <u>up to</u> \$5000 per circuit. Grants may be used for i) Music or Entertainment, ii) Rental of space or Equipment, iii) Food & Beverage, iv) Travel expenses of speakers, and/or v) Programming Fees.
- 5. Every circuit will be eligible for up to a \$5000 grant. Individual circuit funds can be combined with other circuits to host an event that will serve all participating circuits.
- 6. Additional grant awards will be given to circuits that host the most creative and "biggest" event.
- Applications are required and must meet the criteria above to be approved. Please submit printed applications to: <u>Laurie Brown – Michigan District, 3773 Geddes Rd, Ann Arbor, MI 48105</u>. Applications may be reviewed by CEF and the Michigan District up to 30 days after receipt before a decision is made.
- 8. Grants will be paid as reimbursements. Expenses should be submitted <u>after</u> the event has occurred to <u>Kris Nowak Church Extension Fund, 3773 Geddes Rd, Ann Arbor, MI 48105</u>. No receipts will be accepted after 1/24/25. Sales tax will not be reimbursed, and mileage for personal cars for speakers/entertainment will be reimbursed at standard IRS Rates.
- 9. Examples of costs that will not be covered: Gift cards, donations directly to a non-profit organization, speakers/topics that are primarily for ordained professional development, events that do not include lay members of congregations or community, paying for regular Winkel expenses, etc.
- 10. All decisions regarding eligibility or approval are at the complete discretion of CEF and the Michigan District. Decisions will be applied fairly and evenly to all applicants.
