



Michigan District Student Aid Guidelines and Info

“The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.” (Matthew 9:37 – 38).

In prayerful response to our Lord’s command, the Michigan District, LCMS encourages and supports students from our member congregations who are preparing for a church work vocation (Commissioned or Ordained). The District assists in this need by providing financial assistance to qualified students enrolled at one of our approved Concordia University System (CUS) institutions or one of our LCMS seminaries.

To qualify, students must do the following **annually**:

- Be enrolled in one of the following programs at a school under the **Concordia University System (CUS) or LCMS Seminary**:
 - A pastoral or deaconess preparation program (excludes additional degrees and colloquy work)
 - A full time (12 credit hours or more) **undergraduate** program that focuses on producing future church workers or Lutheran educators
 - Be enrolled in a graduate/ certificate program as approved by the Michigan District
- **Read and follow** all application instructions for the *LCMS District Financial Aid Application*, including:
 - Have an intention to enter church work
 - marked **“YES”** on the application form (**includes intended part-time workers**)
 - **Send** applications to the **financial aid office** of the enrolled CUS school or seminary for **section 2 of the form** to be filled out
 - The CUS school or Seminary will mail/email completed forms to the district by **June 1** for those **starting and continuing** their program in the fall or **November 1** for those **starting** their program in the spring **who have never applied for aid before**.
- **Complete and Mail/email** the *Pastoral Verification Form* to the **District Office** by the proper due dates:
 - **June 1** for those starting in the fall semester (**and/or requesting aid again**)
 - **November 1** for those enrolled in their first program semester in the spring (**and have never applied for aid before**)
 - **If you wish to email your pastoral form:**

 - **Mark the box** on the Verification Form

Additional Terms:

- Be enrolled in a program that will provide educational qualifications necessary to be eligible for a **first call as a commissioned worker or an ordained pastor** of the LCMS
- Be a **member** of a Michigan District, LCMS Congregation
- **Maintain eligibility** to remain in the qualifying program of study (maintain GPA, etc.)
- **Agree** that, if the student does not complete his/her program of study for church work and /or does not maintain at least a two-year commitment to church work, **all grant money shall be repaid to the Michigan District**

The Michigan District sets a base amount each year, and aid is awarded according to the following percentages of the base amount:

Seminaries

• Traditional Pastoral Route (M.Div.)	100%	4 years max
• Residential Alternate Route	100%	4 years max
• Center for Hispanic Studies	Per individual covenant	
• Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology	Per individual covenant	
• Pastoral student studying abroad through LCMS seminary	100%	1 extra year
• Deaconess program (full time)	60%	2 years max
• Deaconess program (part time)	30%	4 years max
• Specific Ministry Pastor (SMP)	150%	4 years max
• SMP to General Pastoral Certification (GPC)	30%	4 years max

Concordia University System (full time students only)

• Undergraduate at Concordia University Ann Arbor	80%	5 years max
• Undergraduate at Concordia University Wisconsin	80%	5 years max
• Undergraduate at other CUS school	60%	5 years max
• Approved Graduate/Certificate programs at CUS school	30%	2 years max

For an example of how District aid works, say a M. Div student receives about \$3,000* dollars from the District to cover two semesters of an academic year at seminary. If that student continued to ask for aid for all eight semesters, that student could save up to \$12,000.

And, if the hypothetical student started as a pre-sem student in their undergrad studies at Concordia in Wisconsin/ Ann Arbor and applied for aid during their enrollment, that would result in roughly \$24,000 for a total of up to nine years of schooling.

Or, say a student is preparing to be a Lutheran School teacher. Following the example above, if that student went to Concordia University Chicago in River Forest and needed a fifth year to finish their schooling, they could be covered with about \$9,000 of aid for ten semesters of education. For both examples of student that money is courtesy of LCMS congregation members wishing to encourage a new generation of pastors and church workers.

*Base amount changes annually.

Special considerations and modifications at any time are at the discretion of the Michigan District.
