Krengel	his Ph.D. dissertation on this topic. Dr. Shirley Morgenthaler was his dissertation chairwoman	
	at CUC. His research studied the Pastor-Director relationship across the Texas District of the	
	LCMS. Some of the issues that this professional relationship struggles with were identified	
	through multiple research techniques. By addressing the issues that were discovered in the	
	research, more Pastor-Director Dyads (professional pairs) may find their way to enjoy	
	high-quality professional relationships. If such a goal may be achieved, then high "process	
	quality" may also be achieved within the church-preschool ministry. Finally, improved process	
	quality may be used by the Holy Spirit to bring more souls more comfort through the Gospel	
	of Jesus Christ. Rev. Dr. Krengel was also part of a ministry team that reached out to a	
	fast-growing suburb of Houston by building a second ministry location which was primarily	
	used for foundational education. The preschool ministry went from 55 students to over 150
